

In 1995, Union Pacific purchased the Chicago and Northwestern and integrated the operation with its own. Re-painting of the recently-acquired locomotives took place slowly, especially for the newer units (like the Dash 9s) whose paint jobs were only 1-2 years old at the time of the merger. Therefore, patched and renumbered CNW locomotives continued to operate on the UP system for many years.

ROAD NUMBER SPECIFIC FEATURES:

- #9675 "Primered" replacement air conditioner, "replacement" equipment door from a UP-painted loco, medium-height snowplow
- #9696 UP logos on sides of nose, burn marks on engine compartment, ghost outline of original CNW road number (8632), large snowplow
- #9741 UP logos on side equipment doors, medium snowplow, lasted in CNW paint until at least 2018

Delivered in 2000, these Dash 9-44CWs were the first and only units delivered to BC Rail with the standard GE wide cab- albeit with the "teardrop" style front cab windows. Being the road's newest engines, they were used in all types of heavy freight service. In 2004, BC Rail was leased for 60 years to CN, so the units can now be spotted running with a variety of CN power.







- · Medium angled snowplows

The power-short Burlington Northern Santa Fe placed some of these 1998-built units immediately into service without their stripes and logos. A simple black road number and reporting mark adorned the cab sides. Along with the multitude of Superfleet, Cascade Green and Freightbonnet units running around at the time, it made for some truly colorful lashups of power!










The leases on many BNSF Dash 9-44CWs have expired, and in many cases BNSF has chosen not to renew them. GECX 4809 in one of many BNSF-painted Dash 9's that feature simple patch lettering in a variety of styles, along with a fairly clean patch-job of the BNSF lógos.












The last stand of the "Standard Cab", these 4000hp, 1995-built units have earned the railfan nickname of "Top Hats" due to their rooftop mounted air conditioners. NS 8764-8888, a total of 125 units, were the first in a series of yearly NS orders from 1995 to 2005. They have since been retired, with some being used for the AC44C6M rebuild program.



Built by GE from 1993 until 2004, the Dash 9-44CW and its variants were the definitive North American mainline freight locomotives of their time, with an impressive 3668 total units built. Constructed for US railroads from coast to coast, the units were also ordered by Canadian roads, and significant export orders went to Australia and Brazil

The Athearn Genesis Dash 9-44CW is equally as impressive as its prototype, with a host of railroad specific details. From Canadian National's unique "tear drop" windows to the early body details on Southern Pacific and Santa Fe, these models take the Genesis line to new heights.
